**Adult Community Member Specific Responsibilities**

JWC Board Responsibilities:

- Participate in JWC Board Meetings to include:
  - Provide a report of activities since the last JWC Board Meeting.
  - Recommend changes to JWC Policies or Bylaws to address lessons learned.
  - Nominate Director candidates.
  - Nominate Board member candidates.
  - Participate in Board discussions.
  - Make motions.
  - Second motions.
  - Vote on motions brought before the Board.
- Participate in Board discussions that take place outside of official meetings (generally email discussions).
- Keep the Community informed of Journey With Christ activities, issues, and needs.
- Inform Board of Community issues and needs.
- Serve on a JWC Committee
